# **President's Update**

Dear Student Senate Family,

As I sit down to write this final newsletter, I find myself filled with emotion, both gratitude for this journey and a sense of bittersweet closure. This marks the end of one of the most transformative chapters of my life, and I would like to take a moment to reflect, celebrate, and bid farewell - not just as your President, but as someone who has grown deeply alongside each of you.

If you had told me years ago that I would serve as President of the largest system of higher education in the entire country, I wouldn't have believed you. After all, I am a first-generation, low-income, cancer survivor and English learner. Statistically, I wasn't supposed to be here. But somehow, I found my way, and more importantly, I found you: people who believed in me, who saw something in me, and who reminded me of the power of voice and the change we can create together.

Serving as your President this year has been the greatest honor of my life. We represented over 2 million students, advocated on the steps of the Capitol, collaborated with system partners, and brought student voices to national stages like <u>HACU</u>, <u>EWA</u>, and <u>NCORE</u>. We traveled across the state, hosted powerful board meetings, and organized transformative events like the Advocacy Academy and the General Assembly. We laughed, cried, challenged each other, and celebrated victories big and small.

And yet, it hasn't always been easy. We faced challenging moments: internal conflicts, difficult decisions, and public scrutiny. We navigated long hours, packed agendas, and moments when we questioned whether we...

# **Accomplishments**

Thanks to student-led advocacy, several key investments were secured in the state budget:

- \$20 million (onetime) for flexible emergency aid, including support for mixed-status students
- \$15 million (onetime) to support
  Dream Resource
  Liaisons
- Full funding for Cal Grant, including increases to accommodate growing student caseloads
- \$52 million restored for CalFresh student support, directly benefiting Basic Needs Centers
- \$15 million (onetime) and \$5 million (ongoing) for Credit for Prior Learning initiatives

These critical wins are the result of the SSCCC's persistent advocacy through coalition partnerships, public comment, and delegatedriven resolutions that elevate student priorities in state policy.

As we each turn the page to our next chapter - whether it's transferring, graduating, or stepping into new roles - I want to remind you of something important: sometimes, the dream isn't just yours, it belongs to those who see themselves in you.

Carry that truth with you. Let it ground you in purpose and remind you that the work never ends, it just evolves. The Student Senate for California Community Colleges is more than an organization. It is a movement. And I am forever grateful to have been part of it.

As this chapter closes, another begins, filled with new adventures, new hopes, and new opportunities to grow. For all we've shared and accomplished, it fills me with joy and pride to say that the 2024–2025 SSCCC season has officially come to an end.

#### **Student Voices in Action**

The SSCCC is proud to share that many of our sponsored and cosponsored bills have successfully passed their first house and are now moving through the second. Our advocacy doesn't stop here, though we're actively engaging in committee hearings to ensure that the student voice is amplified at every step.

## **Our 2025 Sponsored Legislation:**

- AB 409 (Arambula)
- The SSCCC is excited to share that AB 409, which sought to extend teleconferencing exemptions outlined in AB 1855 (Arambula) through January 2030, is in the process of being amended and rolled into <u>SB 707 (Durazo)</u>.
- This strategic move strengthens advocacy efforts statewide by aligning with a broader legislative effort that ensures equitable access to public meetings

- Prepare students to speak confidently with decision-makers, both locally and nationally
